We start the year with 337 students which I believe is a new record for Port Elliot Primary School. Teachers chose to have 13 classes at the end of last year which has allowed us to have slightly smaller class sizes. It has been very pleasing to hear all the positive comments about Port Elliot over the holidays and the parents who have come to enrol through the recommendation of others. Thank you to all of you who spread the word of the good work and dedicated staff of Port Elliot Primary School.

#### Murputja Exchange 2014

This year students in year 6 and 7 will be invited to participate in the Murputja exchange programme. We are currently working with the Murputja Community School to find agreeable dates. We expect this adventure to take place at the beginning of Term 3. It involves at least 2 mini buses of approximately 40 students to the Murputja Aboriginal community on the Anangu Pitjantjatjara Lands in the far North of South Australia. This will be followed by a visit to Uluru and Coober Pedy before returning to Port Elliot. The trip is usually 10 days and quite an experience for students from both schools. If you have a student in these year levels you may like to begin the conversation about going as expression of interest forms will be coming out later this term.

#### <u>Grounds</u>

If you enter the school by the gate next to the office I hope you will have noticed the new railway track garden. This was designed by the grounds committee during 2013 and constructed during the first week of the school holidays.

The railway line was chosen to represent the first railway which linked Port Elliot to Goolwa. We hope to add more to the grounds during the next 12 months as well.

While the landscapers were onsite we modified Hunter's garden space next to the gym by adding in automatic drip irrigation and removing the pebbles and adding a chair for students to use this area as a quiet place.
