#### 2017 planning continues

Thank you to all of the parents who have handed in class placement information for their child(ren). If you wish to submit a form, tomorrow the 11th November 2016 is the last day. Spare forms are available at the front office. Next year there will be 15 classes which is an increase of one class from this year. The staff are making decisions this week on the distribution of the classes with regards to year levels and then learning areas for the various class groups will be assigned. With an additional class starting the current POSHC room will become the 15th class space. This will require POSHC to relocate which is explained in the next article. The aim to have all students placed into their 2017 classes with letters to be sent home with the reports in week 9.

#### Transition of POSHC to outsourcing provider, Camp Australia.

Over the last eight months the process of outsourcing the operation of the Southern Fleurieu Out of School Hours Care (SFOSHC) has been undertaken on behalf of the Victor Harbor R-7 School Governing Council which managed the Port Elliot Out of School Hours Care (POSHC) programme. The outsource process involved working with the Department for Education and Child Development (DECD) and representatives of the Governing Councils of Victor Harbor R-7, Port Elliot and Goolwa Primary Schools and Principals of each site. We have assessed responses to our request for quotation to provide quality OSHC services at all three SFOSHC sites, namely Victor Harbor OSHC (VOSHC), Port Elliot OSHC (POSHC) and Goolwa OSHC (GOSHC). Responses that we scored according to DECD protocols.

**Camp Australia** were chosen on merit. Camp Australia are a national organisation that have been operating for 28 years and run more than 500 OSHC sites across Australia. For more information see <a href="https://www.campaustralia.com.au">www.campaustralia.com.au</a>.

Camp Australia will begin operating after school and vacation care OSHC services at Port Elliot Primary Schools on **Monday**, **19th December 2016**. This is the first day of Vacation Care. Camp Australia will be in touch with OSHC families in the next few weeks to discuss transition.

Camp Australia will preferentially employ current staff where suitable positions are available. We are hoping that this will mean that most staff will have a seamless transition to the new management arrangements.

Information modified as per OSHC families letter from Dr Kerri Love, Chair of Victor Harbor R-7 School 24/10/2016

For Port Elliot Primary School the changes will include:

- The establishment of an OSHC committee which requires two representatives from the Governina Council and two parent representatives children whose attend POSHC. This committee will meet approximately two times a term for less than an hour to work with the Camp Australia managers to ensure the POSHC service is maintained at a high level. Thank you to Helen Bagnell and Kerry Lange who are from Governing Council but we require 2 more representatives whose children use POSHC. - Relocation of the POSHC space to a location where the students of POSHC have access to a kitchen, toilets and all weather play space has required a move to the gym and the current music room. This is to allow the current POSHC space to become a classroom. The Camp Australia representatives have looked over the space and excited with the possibilities. I will be working with Camp Australia to upgrade areas as required over the coming year.
- Currently the number of students regularly attending before school care fluctuates depending on the day and time of year. Therefore it is not a requirement that Camp Australia provide this morning service to Port Elliot Primary School as it may have made the service unviable. However I have already spoken to the managers and they will endeavour to provide before school care as soon as possible. Please keep a look out in upcoming newsletters for an update on this situation.

There will undoubtedly be some teething issues with the transition to the new organisation. However I am hoping that the outcome will be an excellent service in 2017 and beyond.

Can I also take the opportunity to thank Caroline and the current POSHC team who do an outstanding job with our children, running a well organised, fun activity based service. As a POSHC user of I hope that we are able to see you continue to work with the school in the future.

Please call or go and see the friendly staff team at the Kindergarten to collect an enrolment form now.

There is now only one intake in January every year at preschools (exceptions are Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children and children under the Guardianship of the Minister).

If your child has a birthday before 1st May 2017 they are eligible to start full-time Kindergarten in January 2017. If their birthday is after the 1st of May 2017 they must wait for the January intake of 2018, but can still have their name placed on the waiting list ©
