<u>How parents and caregivers can help with solving friendship problems</u>

First and foremost you can help children by listening to them talk about the everyday joys and troubles that arise out of their friendships. Asking what might have led to others reactions can help the child, with your assistance, to think of possible solutions.

Try a problem-solving approach

- Encourage the child to describe what has happened
- Ask about how they felt
- Ask them how they think the other person might see it and how they might be feeling
- Get them to think of ways they could do things differently next time
- Encourage them to try the new approach- get them to practise with you so they feel more confident.
- Check back with your child to see how things turned out.

Overdue Notices

Now that we have parent volunteer Sonia Clarke generating overdue library book notices on a regular basis we are able to keep track of books that are overdue more easily. Parents may have noticed notes coming home more frequently. When your child presents a note the first step is to check to see if the book is still at home. If you think the book has been returned, come to the library and see library staff. They will check the shelves to see if it has found its way back on to the shelf without being returned properly. If it still is not found check your child's classroom book tray or class library as often student borrowed books end up on the class shelf. Check once more at home and then if it is still not found see library staff again and we will mark the book as temporarily lost for a period of time. Parents will be given an invoice to part pay for the replacement cost of the book only after an extensive search and a reasonable period of time has elapsed. Books that are mistakenly returned to the public library in Goolwa or Victor do eventually make their way back to us.

Reading a book at home.

If you're able to listen to your child read at home, there are a few tips to consider.



- Set aside a usual time for reading because routine helps to develop readiness to read.
- Let your child choose the place for reading.
 Successful reading can happen on the floor, out the back ,and in the cubbyhouse!
- Encourage your child to hold the book so he or she becomes familiar with handling it (turning pages and so on). In the case of an e-book that is displayed on a tablet device or computer, give your child time to become familiar with how to navigate through the ebook and interact with it.
