On Thursday 28th July, Port Elliot Primary School participated in National Tree day. 10 classes planted fruit trees around the school. Each class took on the responsibility of removing weeds, digging the bed and planting the trees. The trees were of different varieties including apple, apricot, nectarin, peach, cherry and lemon. Mr Blacker's class planted gum trees near our school oval. This will eventually provide shade for the children when playing near the oval. The classes that planted the trees will be responsible for watering and caring for the trees. We hope that the children of the school can benefit from the fresh fruit it will produce. Our school is working hard on establishing our vegetable garden.

This year we have introduced growing our own seeds and selling our produce to parents. Our summer crop helped pay for the fruit trees. Four lunch play times a week the garden is open and teacher supervised for children to plant, weed and help pick vegetables to sell. We hope that we can eventually sell our fruit on the cart as well.
