The Port Elliot Primary School community expresses our deepest condolences to Emma and Ben Schmaal on the very sad loss of their son Oskar Schmaal, brother to Kooper (in room 5:08) and Emmett (in Kindy).

A memorial service is being held for Oskar this Friday the21st March at 2pm in the Victor Harbor Town Hall. Emma and Ben have invited parents, students and staff to attend to acknowledge the life of Oskar.

<u>Lateness</u>

Staff have been focusing on the school priorities for this year throughout the term. Having analysed the data from last year in regards to attendance and lateness this is an area for improvement. The staff have set the target of 95% of students at school every day and less than 4 students late to school. Currently some days we can exceed 18 students late to school. These targets are ambitious however being late to school disrupts the class and the child who arrives late. The start of the day is when routines are set in place and organisation for learning occurs. It is an excellent opportunity for students to grow independence and prepare themselves for the day.

We are hoping all families arrive at school by 8:50 to start the day. It will be great to see the improvement in Term 2.

First Point of Call

If you have an issue or a concern, your first point of contact should be your child's teacher. You can make them aware of the problem through a note in your child's diary or making contact prior to school starting to arrange a time. Alternatively you can telephone the school and leave a message. Your child's teacher can then contact you.

If an issue is still unresolved after you have met with your child's teacher you may wish to speak with a member of the leadership team who will most often organise a meeting with you and your child's teacher to address the concern. Hopefully this will result in the issue being resolved. Early intervention is a term you will frequently hear teachers use to address the learning concerns of children. It's also an important approach to solving problems before they become bigger issues.

We invite you to follow the above process and work with us to help your child when and if issues arise.

Sports Day

Sports Day is only 2 weeks away on the 3rd of April. This is a fun day for students and families. Trina Doig has included more information on page 3 plus the *Sports Day Programme* is included with today's newsletter. Please note:

- Sports Day is a regular day of attendance. Non attendance requires a note from parents or caregivers.
- Older siblings and past students are expected to attend their high school on this day unless they are part of Victor Harbor High School PE class invited to assist.
- If you wish to take your child home early you must locate your child's teacher and <u>sign your child out</u> with the teacher.
- Spectators are reminded that dogs are not to be on school grounds.
