Driving around the school.

Port Elliot Primary School's location is off of a main road and is an advantage for student safety. However the disadvantage is that the roads are quite narrow and congested especially at the beginning and end of the day. Some parents have contacted me about the driving habits of people using the roads around the school. Please remember safety is paramount. Always drive slowly past the school area particularly during drop off and pick up times. Remember it is 25kph in a school zone. Be aware of reversing when students are about and always choose a safe place to drop off and pick up children.

Tips to save the parking and traffic:

- Walk to school as a family.
- Create a walking school bus with a few families walking together and one or two parent volunteers taking turns supervising.
- Older students could ride their bikes.
- Parking further away and walking, gives students exercise and a chance to talk.
- At the end of the day play on the playground or oval and wait for the traffic to disperse.

We hope that you all are able to move safely to and from school.

Rainbow Fact Subtraction

Instead of having to always count backwards you can use rainbow facts to help with subtraction.

Friendly Numbers

Numbers that are a ten such as 10, 20, 30, 40, 50, 60 etc are friendly numbers. Students can then add 60+2=62 and 90+7=97

Change the Order

If you have more than two numbers to add it can make it easier to change the order. For example 6+3+4+3. If you change the order and make 6+4=10 (a rainbow fact) and 3+3 is a double=6 so all together 10 and 6 make 16.
