





## New school room construction to begin in Term 3, 2020!

Exciting news! After many years of letter writing, phone calls and meetings I can now confirm we will have a new building at Port Elliot Primary before the end of Term 3, 2020 (maybe earlier).

The past 6 months has been spent negotiating tender documents and working with the Education Department facilities to come up with the final location on the courts adjacent building 3, opposite 3:08, Mrs Hancock's room.

This work will require the relocation of the basketball court and fencing. During construction there will be no access to half of the courts and brief interruption to car parking.

We will be working with the successful tender company, Fusco, during this construction period.

Once the building is ready for use, the leadership team will nominate which classes will be located in the new rooms, this could be temporarily for the rest of 2020.

For 2021, there will be the opportunity to relocate more classes to provide more space for students around the school.
