My Sausage Rolls

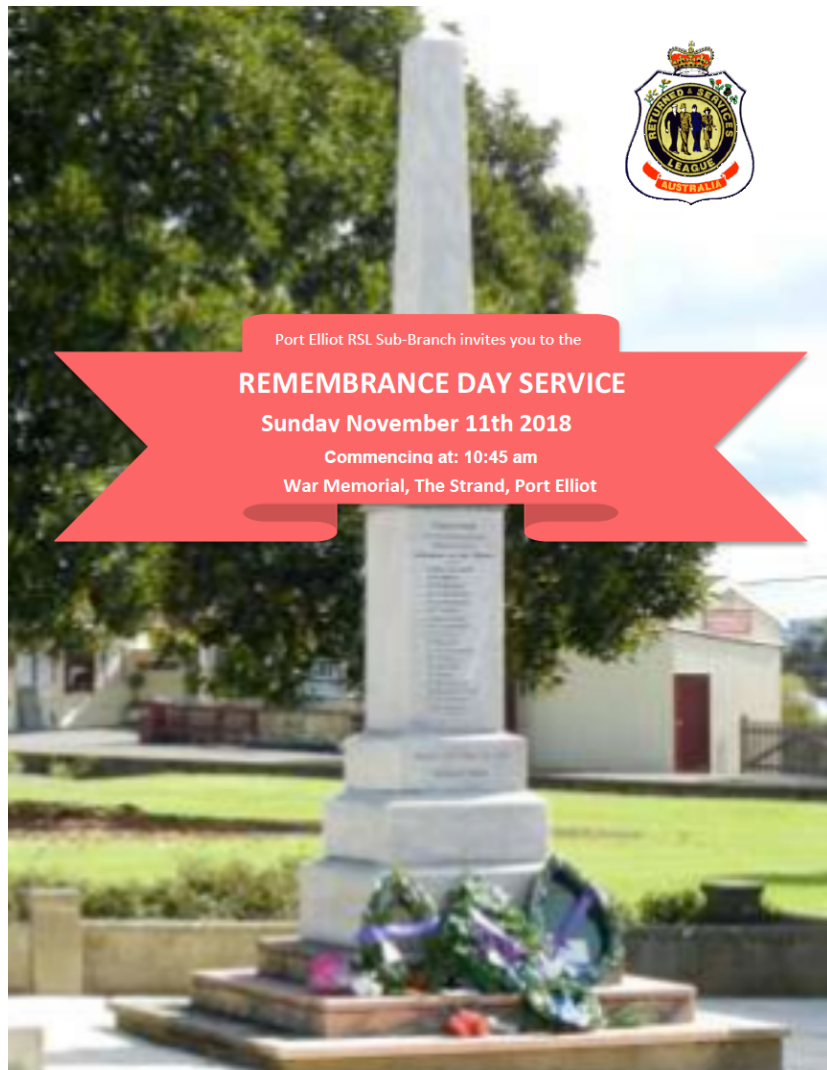
I made sausage rolls for the Port Elliot Show in the school holidays.

The Cross Country season begins in May and continues through to July.
