# ABORIGINAL COMMUNITY EDUCATION OFFICER

Hi I'm Jade, my role acts as the link between Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families and school, and the link between the ATSI community and school - and sometimes the link between community and families. I've been at Port Elliot Primary in this role for the past four years and I LOVE it.

I am an Ngarrindjeri woman who grew up on country in Goolwa. I also have Dutch ancestry on my mother's side. My two boys are Jai 13 who is in his first year at Victor Harbor High and Rhys 10, who is in Yr 5 at Port Elliot Primary.

My role is community-focused which has enabled me to be a part of lots of groups regarding Aboriginal business, particularly on the Fleurieu and means a lot of my work takes place off-site. Some of the groups include the FACIN (Fleurieu Aboriginal and Community Initiatives Network) group which is run out of Victor Harbor Council, the Alexandrina Council NAIDOC working group committee, Miwi-Inyeri Pelepi-Ambi Aboriginal Corporation (MIPAAC), Empowering Communities Board and the Port Elliot Primary Governing Council. I was also selected last year to be on a working group party under SMC and Aboriginal Affairs, working on the growth of Aboriginal Community Controlled Organisations.



Prior to working in Aboriginal Education, I worked as a senior hairdresser for ten years while raising my boys. My mum talked me into doing an apprenticeship under her which I completed in 2004 and took out the ATSI apprentice of the year award for SA.

I am also an aunty, mother, sister, daughter, granddaughter, friend, and up and coming Ngarrindjeri leader in our community.

Some of my favourite things are: sitting around a fire, singing, camping, playing 8ball, experiencing as much live music as possible and being heavily involved in the amazing community that we live in. I am the Pistons basketball club uniform lady and as a family, we are involved with the Goolwa/Port Elliot Football Club, which I have been around since I was born and now my boys play for them.
