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## FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK <br> NAPLAN online

Last week, we completed the NAPLAN online testing. The students in Years $3 \& 5$ have been working their way through the tests on Writing, Reading, Conventions of Language and Numeracy over two weeks.

This was the first time the students had taken part in NAPLAN, given the 2020 tests were cancelled. We have been successfully undertaking the tests using the online format with no interruptions.

The students were able to work their way through questions and navigate the technical aspects well. We look forward to the results and seeing how we as a school can improve and benefit all learners.

Thank you to the staff who supported students during the testing period and to the teachers whose timetables were modified for the testing to occur. A big thank you to Steven Taylor who coordinated the organisation of the tests, Kate Taylor who supported the Year 5 team and to Darryn Burdett, ICT Technician, who ensured all the computers were functioning and was able to troubleshoot on the days.

Parents can expect to receive their child's results in September. In 2023, NAPLAN testing will move to March and it is hoped the results can be returned to schools and families earlier in the school year.

## NATIONAL NUMERACY DAY

Our amazing Year 6 students taught maths games across the whole school and handed out maths game packs for you to play at home with your child. We would love you to reinforce these maths mindset messages at home that mistakes grow brains, you don't have to be fast at maths to be good at maths, believe in yourself and anyone can be good at maths.

You can help at home by talking about the maths in your day, repeating the mindset messages, or asking your child to help solve simple maths problems such as how to share food or work out what time you need to set off.

## Here's an example of a maths story to spark your imagination...

National numeracy day is an important day on my calendar," I told my class.
"Not as Important as our birthdays," they said. We looked up at the birthday board. "That's weird," they said when they noticed how many people had the same birthday.

"And then, of course, you take into account that more people are born in September than any other month..." added Becca, the midwife.
"What? Why?" I asked
"Hmm, maybe that's a story for another time," she said.
