#### **401 - GEOGRAPHY**

In Geography this term, we have been learning about features of places. Following some explicit teaching about natural, managed and constructed features the students worked in pairs to design, create and present a waterpark. The students shared their awesome work with their parents in a very well attended exhibition.









#### Here is one of the presentations:

Hi I am Mariah and this is Enami. This our splashtastic waterpark. Its name is Sensational Splashes. To make it we used pop sticks, glue, boxes, matchsticks and cardboard. First, Jess taught us about natural, managed and constructed features. Then we designed and planned out waterparks. Finally, we made them out of recycled materials. The waterpark had to include at least I natural feature, 3 managed features and 4 constructed features. In our waterpark the beach is the natural feature. The hotdog stand is one of the constructed features and the lawn is managed.
