Michael from Novita came and taught every class in the school over three days how to use sports wheelchairs and played games and basketball in the gym. The students loved it! He was open and honest about life as a wheelchair athlete and living day to day life with a disability.

We had at least two personal video Morning Motivation Messages each day from Olympians and Elite Athletes telling us about how PE at school has been so influential and important in their lives.

Our personal messages came from 2x Olympian and International Hall of Fame Soccer player Di Cleary (Nee Alagich), 2x Olympian and Bronze medallist Kayaker Hannah Davis, World Cup and USA Minor League Baseballer Paul Mildren, 5x World Cup and International best Lacrosse player in the world Hannah Nielsen, World Cup rower and AFL footballer Barnaby French, SA Scorpions Women's Cricket team, 4x World Cup Lacrosse player Nigel Morton, and lastly an extra special one for the JP from kids entertainer KimmiBop!









On Wednesday, staff and students represented their team colours with pride and made gold coin donations to help cover the costs of the wheelchair sports lessons. A big thanks to all those who donated.
