### Congratulations on another successful year of school

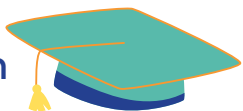

## Year 6 Graduation

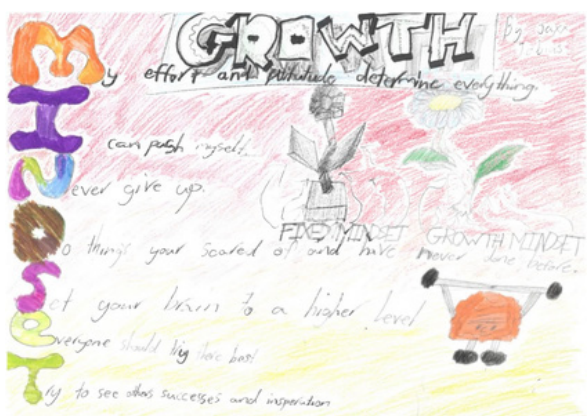

## CHILDREN'S UNIVERSITY

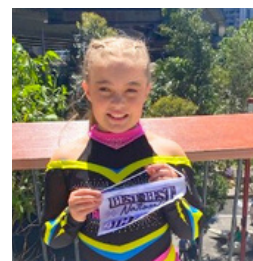
