Parking on a corner is unsafe and illegal. This is designated by a yellow painted line. If you park on the line it is unsafe and you may be fined.

We appreciate the difficulties with drop off and pick up but hopefully if we all work together the busy periods can flow more efficiently. If you wish to complete a U turn when driving past the showgrounds please use the large carpark adjacent to the dog park as this is a safer area.

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
