Student Free Days June 8th and 9th

Each school has the opportunity for 4 student free days per year. The days provide an opportunity for the whole staff to be together to attend conferences and to share ideas and best practice with other educators. These days give staff an opportunity to reflect on their practice and they are vital to improving what we do with students as we are always learning and improving our work.

During the last two student free days on June 8th and 9th staff had the opportunity to attend a number of different events. Here are two of the highlights.

SERU (Special Education Resource Unit) Visit.

A number of Teachers and SSOs visited the DECD Special Education Resource Unit which is based in Henley Beach. The staff viewed an extensive range of resources and equipment which can be hired free of charge to DECD schools to support individual students. Teachers and SSOs have joined the SERU library and resources have already been ordered with many arriving this week.

EDUtech conference.

Fourteen staff travelled to Sydney to attend the largest education conference in the Southern Hemisphere. Along with 8800 educators we gathered to hear key note speakers in the areas of Mindset (Carol Dweck), Mark Scott (CEO, NSW Education) and other leaders in the implementation of Information Communication Technology in Education from around the world.

The conference also offered workshops which staff chose based on interest. Our staff chose to go to different sessions in groups to gain knowledge and understanding in a broader range of areas. Many speakers in these workshop sessions spoke about STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) and the need to ensure all students have the opportunity to engage with these subjects. The staff who attended EDUtech have been enthusiastic in their conversations and sharing of technical gadgets and items collected and the conference. There has been discussion and initial planning about how to implement some of these ideas into classrooms and across the site. I look forward to seeing the results of this new staff learning and how this transfers into classrooms in the

coming months and in the longer term. This week classes have been trying out 3D printing for the first time using the Makers Empire software program which is an exciting step forward in our work in STEM and ICT.

This year Reconciliation Week marked the anniversary of two really special dates.

It has been 50 years since the 1967 Referendum, a massive step in equality for Aboriginal people.

On the 3rd June it had been 25 years since the Mabo decision. Eddie 'Koiki' Mabo was a Mer 'Murray' Island man. He fought for eleven years for the native title of the land that he knew in his heart was always his and his peoples land. He sadly passed away before he got to see the fruits of his fight. Today his family, his people and many Australians honour him and his commitment. That decision changed the way for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island people. The notion of Terra Nullius was destroyed.





For Reconciliation Week, our students took part in some rock painting. They loved it. They had to go and select their own sticks/leaves etc to paint with. We yarned about what Reconciliation means and really enjoyed doing the art out in the courtyard - as you can see!



NAIDOC WEEK is coming up in week 10. It is always held in the first full week of July. This year it commences on the 2nd July – 9th. NAIDOC gives us the opportunity to celebrate Aboriginal and Islander people, history, culture and achievement. Our ATSI students are taking part in the Victor Harbor NAIDOC march on Tuesday 4th July. We did an inquiry into the shipwrecks off of Horseshoe Bay finding no photos so we reasearched what type they were and then built a model of the Tall Ship.

We also learnt and wrote a story about the rescue of the Flying Fish crew in the 1860's.



Lyla -: I learned how to make a ship. My ships name was Josephine Loizeau. It was a used for passengers and cargo. **Reilly-:**The Harry was built in 1842 and it was shipwrecked on the 9th December 1865. It was used to carry cargo.



Will-:My boat got shipwrecked in May 15th1853 it was called the Emu.



Mecki-:My ship was shipwrecked on 6th September 1856. The ship was The Lapwing, it was used for carrying wheat and timber.


Times-: 6.30pm to 8pm-7-11 years olds
