As a Kidsmatter school we believe that good mental health is a key contributing factor to the success of students in all aspects of their education.

It's a fact that children can be taught how to cope with their emotions, to bounce back from problems, and to develop positive relationships – this is called 'social and emotional learning'.

Currently your child is involved in SEL (Social and Emotional Learning) lessons. This term we are focussing on "What makes a great classmate". Understanding the difference, dealing with and developing strategies to cope with, "Rude versus mean versus bullying" behaviours at any level. We are also developing a common agreement of what Port Elliot Primary School expects in behaviour from our students.

It's also a fact that a child's family is the first and biggest influence on their child's mental health. Basically, families can teach children these skills as early as possible in life – even from when they're babies!

KidsMatter provides families with a range of information sheets to help them support children's mental health and wellbeing, and to recognise if and when professional help is needed.

They contain practical information, tips, and strategies across a range of common childhood issues, and were prepared by professionals experienced in the area of children's mental health and development. Please take time to look at their website!

On Wednesday we were going to the zoo. We left school at 8.00am the bus trip was fun in the first bit on the way there but it was a little bit too long.


Once we got off the bus we all had a piece of fruit. I had strawberries and grapes. The first thing we did at the zoo was go to the Education Centre.
